1st Sunday of Lent

1st Reading: Genesis 9:8-15 - The drama of the building of the ark, its loading and the rising of the waters can overshadow what should be the most powerful moment in the story of Noah: The establishment of God's covenant with Noah and his descendants. This promise everlasting is the powerful covenant made with Abraham later in Genesis. The covenant is generated by God, who takes responsibility for its fulfilment, offering a sign of affirmation to humankind (the rainbow). Note the parallels between this account of God's promise and the process of creation to Genesis1. 2nd Reading: 1 Peter 3:18-22 - The destructive power of water is not contrasted with the lifegiving power of water in Peter's letter. In Christ Jesus, suffering is not meaningless but ennobled. The passage includes a creedal element, outlining the Paschal Mystery and its promise. The gift of Baptism is one of liberation for all, not salvation for a few as in the story of Noah. Gospel: Mark 1:12-15 - In Mark, the beginning of Jesus' journey is his experience of forty days in the wilderness. His account is terser than that of Matthew and Luke, which also makes its message quite direct. Jesus has been tested, like the Israelite were tested by the forty years of wandering in the wilderness to the Promised Land and Noah was tested with forty days afloat in the flood waters. Under the protection of God's angels, he has triumphed, proving his readiness for his earthly mission. The number forty appears in dozens of places in the Bible, usually signifying a test that has been administered and passed. As we enter the forty days of Lent, we can challenge ourselves to embrace the spiritual test we are facing, transforming them---and ourselves---as we journey to Easter.

It's Okay to be Tempted

True. But it is not okay to give in. Jest as Jesus spent his forty days in the desert protected by the Spirit, let us have the same trust that God guides us on this Lenten retreat to right Kingdom thinking, speaking, and behaving. Let us sing with the Psalmist that God's ways are love and truth, guiding the humble to justice.


- Since the Kingdom of God is at hand, how will I repent?
